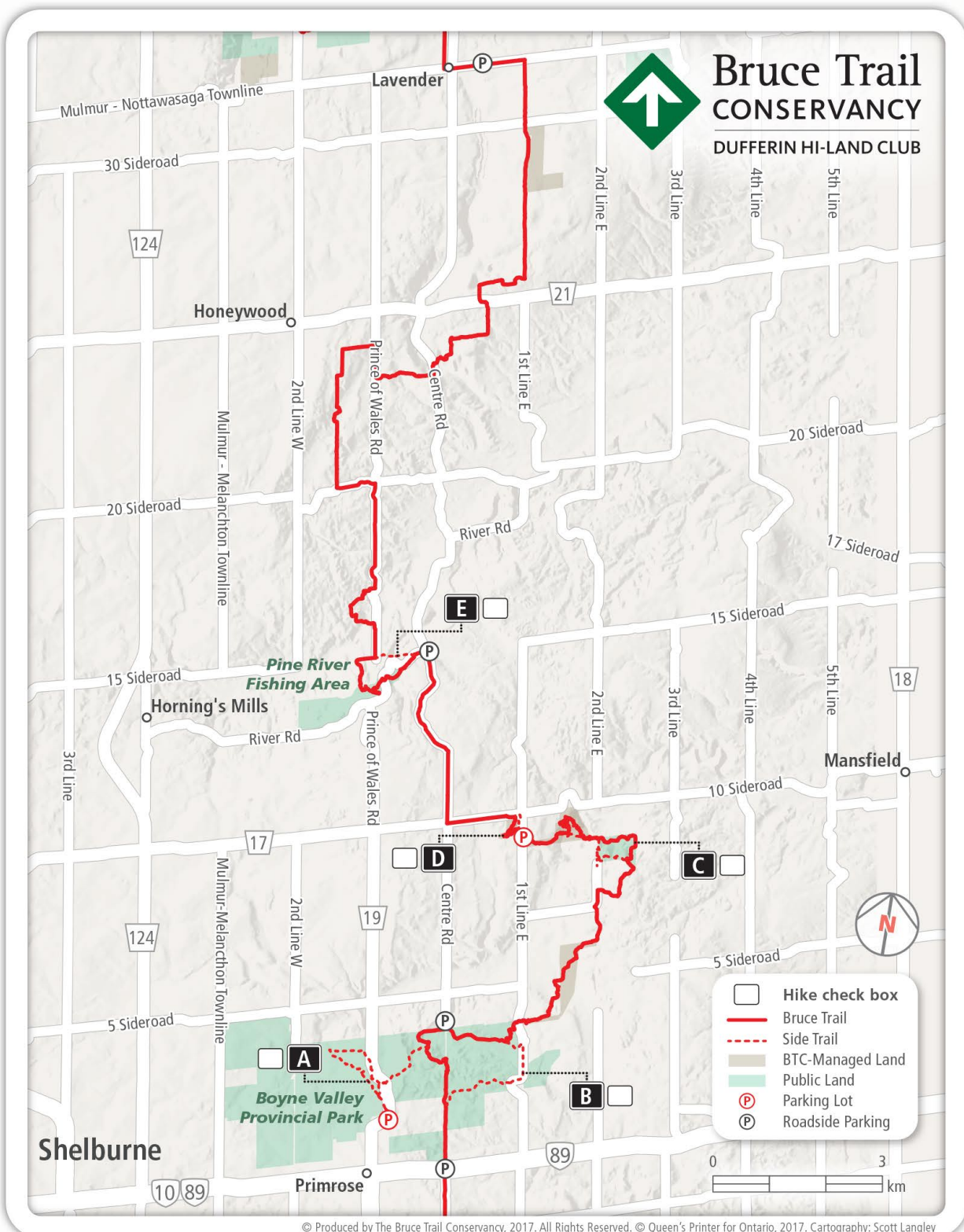
The Bruce Trail Mulmur Passport Walk Series has 5 designated loop trails to be completed, in any order, between May 6 and October 9. A loop trail brings you back to the place you start. Find the trail code halfway through the hike and write it on your passport.

Send in your completed passport to the Township Office by October 9, 2017 and receive a 'Hiking in Mulmur' commemorative patch. You will also be entered into a draw for a \$200 gift certificate to Mountain Equipment Co-op, a Bruce Trail Conservancy/Dufferin Hi-Land Club one year family membership and other fantastic prizes.

## Bruce Trail Users' Code & Hiking Tips

- Hike only along marked routes - do not take shortcuts
- Obey all signage
- Respect the privacy of people living along the trail
- Leave the trail cleaner than you found it - carry out all litter
- Leave flowers and plants for others to enjoy
- Keep dogs on a leash and under control at all times
- Do not disturb wildlife or farm animals
- Leave only your thanks and take nothing but photographs
- Dress in layers
- Bring a cell phone
- Pack water and a snack
- Bring a buddy
- Check the weather
- Carry identification
- Bring a map

## Bruce Trail Mulmur Passport Walk Series

### A Primrose Loop - 3.3 km

Park in the parking lot on County Road 19 (Prince of Wales) located just east of the bridge over the Boyne River. Walk north on the road about 80 metres and take the Prince of Wales Side Trail on your left 520 metres to the junction with the Primrose Loop Side Trail. Follow the Primrose Loop Side Trail as a loop, returning to this point and take the Prince of Wales Side Trail back to County Road 19 and the parking lot.

### B Boyne Valley Loop - 6.4 km

Park in the lot at the end of Centre Road south of 5 Sideroad. Walk south to the Main Trail, and take this in either direction to the Boyne Valley Side Trail, and follow this Side Trail back to the Main Trail to form a loop. Along the way take the Murphy's Pinnacle Side Trail to the lookout.

### C Oliver Creek Loop - 6.4 km

Park at the BTC lot on 1st Line 300 metres south of 10 Sideroad. Walk east on the Main Trail 3.7 km to the 2nd junction with the Oliver Creek Side Trail. Take this trail west and then north back to the Main Trail and go left. At the junction of the Moss Haven Side Trail go left on this Side Trail back to the Main Trail. Go left on the Main Trail back to the parking lot.

### D Rockhill Loop - 2.1 km

Park at the BTC parking lot on 1st Line 300 metres south of 10 Sideroad. Walk north 100 metres along 1st Line and take the Main Trail on your left. 100 metres in, at the junction of the Rock Hill Park Side Trail, go right and follow this trail to the end. Go straight (south) on the Main Trail, walk the David Hahn Side Trail loop and then take the Main Trail back to 1st Line and the parking lot.

### E Kilgorie Loop - 3.6 km

Park on Centre Road in Kilgorie just south of River Road near the mail boxes. Walk west on River Road past the Kilgorie School (estab. 1909) and take the Main Trail on your left just before the bridge. Go past the Dufferin Light and Power Station ruins to River Road. Go right, cross the bridge and go left, up to the Bell Lookout Side Trail. Take this trail to the lookout overlooking the Pine River Fishing Area. Retrace your steps back to the Main Trail and go right on the Main Trail to 15 Sideroad. Go right to the intersection of Prince of Wales and the junction with the Kilgorie Side Trail. Keep going straight on this Side Trail back to River Road. Go left on River Road back to Centre Road.
