Spring Load Restrictions

Spring load restrictions are now in effect on all Township of Mulmur and County of Dufferin Roads. As per the Highway Traffic Act, loads must be kept under 5 tonnes per axle on all

roads.

The restriction period typically occurs between March 1st and May 15th and is dependent on weather and road conditions.
