





Black History

"Black History is Canadian History."

Deputy Mayor Steve Anderson, Shelbourne, Dufferin County

Then: The history of Black Settlers in our region is difficult to uncover. Historic documents focus on European immigrants who made up the majority of the population during settlement, such as those who came from England, Ireland and Scotland. While the MoD is fortunate to have a photograph and information on William and Mary Ghant (pictured), it is rare to find these archival resources in our collection. Research is ongoing and recently MoD staff have found a reference in the 1911 Mulmur Census to Norman, Alice and Annie Smith. Their story as Black Settlers is another "hidden history" that we are working to uncover.

Deputy Mayor Steve Anderson, Town of Shelburne

Mary and William Ghant are believed to be emancipated slaves, who came from New York State to Melancthon Township, Durferin County in 1851 with their two sons. For over 25 years the family owned and worked an impressive 300 acres of familiand. They tilled the land with their team of oxen and mised crops of oats, peas and barley, During the maple syrup season, they tapped over 250 maple trees. Eventually they bought land further north and established several more family farms. (Museum of Dufferin Collection, P-3880-006)

Your Roads

How do we determine the salt/sand ratio?

The salt sand ratio is between 3 to 5 %. This is to stop the sand from freezing, sand is used on lower classes of roads to supply traction.

What is the difference in care on paved roads vs gravel?

The Township of Mulmur has two different levels of service 1.Gravel Roads - Track Bare to snow packed, 2.Paved Roads - Centre Bare to Bare

Why can't you use pure salt?



The use of pure salt can not be used on Gravel Roads as it will melt the surface of the road turning it into mud.

Pure salt cannot be used on low volume paved roads either. To make salt work properly a steady flow of traffic is required when the air temperature is above - 18 degrees.

What is the purpose of a grader?

Graders are used for two purposes in the winter.


1. They are used as snow plows the same as the trucks.

2. They are used to ice blade the gravel roads, ice blading is done by using special blade that have 1 inch teeth that brakes up the hard packed snow or ice and allows the tire to grip the gravel/snow packed surface of the road.





Municipal Register of Historical Properties



Council is pleased recognize "The Parsonage" in Mansfield through the inclusion on the municipal register of historical properties.

The land was originally purchased in 1904 by the Trustees of the Methodist Church. When many of the churches amalgamated, and the Mansfield United Church was constructed in 1925, the Parsonage then became associated with the new Mansfield United Church and referred to as the Manse. Original woodwork, windows, doors and architectural features remain intact. The small barn behind the house still maintains the original barnwood, horse stalls and metal rings used to secure the horses. Many residents have fond memories of attending meetings at the Manse, visiting as children, and participating in cleaning bees in preparation for incoming ministers and families.

Identifying properties of cultural heritage value is an essential part of municipal heritage conservation. The Township is proud to recognize and include the Mansfield "Parsonage" on its Municipal Register of Historical Properties.

More Homes For Everyone Act

On March 30, 2022, the Ontario government introduced Bill 109, the More Homes For Everyone Act which is intended to expedite the planning process including mandating the delegation site of plan approval to staff. Mulmur Council passed the following resolution expressing concern that Bill 109 is removing local input and the



decision making of elected officials.

WHEREAS Council supports removing red tape and expediting the creation of affordable housing through the proper review and approval

AND WHEREAS Council values citizen input, professional planning recommendations and elected Official decision making;

NOW THEREFORE, Council provides the following comments on Bill 109:

- 1. Final Decision making should rest with elected officials
- 2. Planners recommendations should be subject to public input and local expertise
- 3. Ratepayers should not be subsidizing development applications through refunds to application fees intended to cover the cost of processing applications
- 4. That a definition of minor rezoning has not been established
- 5. Planners should not be put in a position of having to be experts and decision makers over all other disciplines
- Delegating authority for site plans and creating penalties for site plan and minor rezonings will not solve housing crisis, as the proposed legislation targets single lot developments opposed to large scale residential development.

AND FURTHERMORE THAT a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Province of Ontario, Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing, Environmental Registry, the County of Dufferin and all Ontario municipalities.





Increasing Access to High-Speed Internet in Dufferin County

As part of the Ontario government's plan to connect every community in the province to highspeed internet by 2025, the government is making significant investment to build new broadband infrastructure in Dufferin County.

MPP Sylvia Jones and Perth Wellington MPP Randy Pettapiece, Parliamentary Assistant to Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs met recently in Mansfield for a SWIFT announcement.

Joining the MPPs were Milton MP Adam van Koeverden, Bell Representative Simon Dwyer, Township of Mulmur Mayor Janet Horner, Dufferin County Warden Wade Mills and Township of Amaranth Deputy Mayor Chris Gerrits.



In partnership with Southwestern Integrated Fibre Technology (SWIFT) Inc., construction has commenced on a broadband network that will soon support fast, reliable high speed internet to more than 640 homes, businesses and farms in the communities of Redickville, Honeywood, Black Bank, Ruskview, Terra Nova, Kilgorie, Horning's Mills, Whitfield and Springwater Lakes by November 2022.
