Agricultural Trespassing in Dufferin County

(DUFFERIN COUNTY, ON) -The Dufferin Detachment of the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) is noticing an increase in agricultural trespassing in Dufferin County, culminating in a serious instance being shared on social media.

On the Canada Long Weekend there were two occurrences of people stopping on the side of Highway 10 in Melancthon Township and entering a Canola field to take photos. While Canola is beautiful at this time of year, it is a crop. It is a large part of plant-based diets and a source of income for our farmers. The potential damage to this crop is valued at \$2000 if only one acre is damaged. It will increase if there was a larger area affected.

Fields containing crops are not required to have fences or signage to deter people from entering, as stated in the Trespass to Property Act. Therefore, entering a field, whether it is on foot or with an off-road vehicle, is trespassing. If a person damages crops, then a criminal charge of Mischief could be considered by a responding police officer.

While Dufferin OPP will be monitoring for these situations, we do need public assistance. The situation that happened this past weekend was captured by photo, but a timely phone call to the police was not made. Dufferin OPP asks that if you see this happening, please call 1-888-310-1122 and report it immediately.





MANDATE:

ACHEIVEMENTS:

Outcome: The confidential email list is distributed to 816 emails. This number changes monthly. This milestone remains ongoing.

Outcome: Creation of magnets for distribution. Review of quarterly reports to identify gaps in communications and continue to improve engagement.

Outcome: Inclusion of a monthly newsletter question was implemented in October 2021 and remains in place.

5. Reach out to community social media groups to receive permission to post directly on their social media pages

Outcome: Messaging on the Township platforms continue to be shared by other users.

Goal #2: Provided recommendation and direction on communication gaps in the 2022 Municipal Election.

Outcome: Recommendations were given to staff to ways to highlight candidates and the all candidates meeting.



A vacancy exists on the Township of Mulmur Council for one (1) Councillor position. Council will fill this vacancy by appointment in accordance with the Township of Mulmur Council Vacancy Appointment Policy.

The term of this position is from the date of the Council appointment for the balance of the Council term until November 14, 2022.

A candidate for municipal office must be a qualified municipal elector as set out in the Municipal Elections Act, 1996, being:

- 18 years of age or older;
- A Canadian Citizen
- A resident of the Township of Mulmur, or an owner or tenant of land in the Township or the spouse of such an owner or tenant, and
- Not prohibited from voting under any other Act or disgualified from holding municipal office.

Interested candidates may submit, **in person** with identification, a completed Council Vacancy Application Form, Council Vacancy Declaration of Qualification Form, and Consent to Provide Candidate Contact Information Form **by 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday**, **June 29, 2022** at the Township Administrative Office.

Candidate(s) may also submit, to the Clerk, a personal statement of qualification for consideration of Council. Personal statements will be typewritten in a 12-point font on letter size (8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11") paper, shall not exceed two (2) pages in length and will include the Candidate(s) name and address. Statements that do not meet these requirements shall not be included in any Council meeting agenda or provided to Council by the Clerk.

Certified registered Candidates will be afforded the opportunity to address Council for a period of not more than five (5) minutes and will be asked questions by Council in an open Public Meeting to be held on Wednesday July 6, 2022 at 9:00 am in Council Chambers at the Township Municipal Office.

2021 Financial Statements

Matthew Betik, Partner and Auditor at KPMG LLP presented the 2021 Financial Statements at the June Council Meeting.

The Financial Statements showed good indicators of increasing reserves and decreasing debt and a leveling out of taxation. Mulmur's debt levels are relatively low and no adjusting entries were required.

Approximately 54% of the Township's assets are halfway through their lifespan. The Township is currently updating its asset management plan to show where more money is required to be saved.





Farmer cost-sharing for the Climate Emergency!

The Ontario Soil and Crop Improvement Association (OSCIA) is delivering the new On-Farm Climate Action Fund (OFCAF) to Ontario farmers.

Practices that will be supported under the program include infield nitrogen management, cover cropping practices, and establishing or expanding rotational grazing systems.

Planting new acres of cover crops, or leaving a cover crop over winter where it has always been terminated in the fall.




