SUBJECT: Mulmur 175

# **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this report is to seek Council's direction regarding a Township event for the Mulmur 175<sup>th</sup> Celebrations.

# **BACKGROUND:**

At the July 2, 2025 meeting, staff presented Council with a community-driven approach and draft schedule of events to celebrate Mulmur's upcoming 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Council passed the following resolution:

# Moved by Clark and Seconded by Cunningham

That Council approve the approach to celebrating Mulmur's 175<sup>th</sup> Anniversary through community led events throughout 2026, substantially in the form attached hereto. **Carried.** 

Following Council's decision, the plan was provided to the Economic Development Committee (EDC) at their next scheduled meeting on September 11, 2025. Members supported taking on the 175<sup>th</sup> Celebration as a task of the EDC instead of creating a subcommittee, as the approach supports local businesses and initiatives through the community driven approach approved by Council.

The EDC requested that the reserves set aside for the 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary be made part of the EDC budget for 2026 to support the draft calendar of community and Township events.

At the September 3, 2025 Council meeting, Councillor Clark requested an update on the Mulmur 175th be added as an item for future meetings.

## ANALYSIS:

# Calendar of Events

The first newsletter of 2026 will be a paper newsletter, mailed in conjunction with the tax bill around the middle of January. This newsletter will contain an announcement of the 175<sup>th</sup> Celebration and reference the online calendar where 175 Celebrations, being hosted by the community, will be listed. Based on the July 2025 decision of Council, staff advanced the calendar and created a corresponding budget for inclusion in the 2026 budget.

# <u>Election</u>

During the 2026 municipal election period, commencing May 1<sup>st</sup>, and any potential lame duck phase, Council members should only participate in community events in a personal and non-official capacity. This approach helps maintain neutrality, avoid any perception of electioneering, and upholds public trust.

During the election period, it is important that staff and/or volunteers facilitate events to ensure continuity and community engagement.

As of November 14, 2026 the Economic Development Committee is dissolved with the 2022-2026 term of Council, after which oversight of 175 initiatives will fall to staff.

# Township 175 Celebration

Council may direct staff to organize a Township 175 celebration.

## FINANCIAL IMPACTS:

The first draft of the Township budget includes maintaining the Economic Development Reserve account (for opportunities such the Township share for ROD grants) and adding \$3,400 to the 2026 budget to specifically support the community led 175<sup>th</sup> celebration.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS:**

There are minimal environmental impacts with the encouragement of community events and social gatherings. Additional impacts are associated with specific activities such as driving tours.

# **CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATION:**

It is recommended:

Continue to support the community led events approach to the 175 celebration, recognizing its value in promoting local businesses, fostering community engagement, and offering a diverse range of event types that reflect all areas and demographics of the Township;

And that council direct staff to participate in community-led celebrations in a supportive and collaborative capacity;

And that council direct staff to proceed with the Township-led events as discussed.

## Purpose:

The purpose of this report is to provide Council with a draft approach and schedule of events for Mulmur's 175 Anniversary in 2026.

# **Background and Analysis:**

In 2026, Mulmur celebrates a significant milestone—its 175th anniversary. The outline below highlights a series of yearlong events and initiatives designed to honour the Township's rich heritage while fostering community engagement across all demographics, groups and regions.

By leverage existing and new events, and collaborating with community partners, organizations, and businesses, Mulmur will aim to deliver accessible and diverse programming and promote community pride, engagement, and celebration across the Township. These initiatives achieve the following Strategic Plan goals:

#### It's in our Nature: Live

- Gather Together: Host a 175<sup>th</sup> Birthday
- Gather Together: Support Local Events
- Partner with Others: Collaborate with private recreational service providers
- Partner with Others: Support local use of the Bruce Trail

The focus will be on incorporating the 175th Anniversary into a variety of activities that highlight Mulmur's natural beauty, rich history, and strong community spirit. Key features of the anniversary programming include:

**Travelling Township Booth (Tent & Table):** At each event the Township will have a dedicated tent/table. This travelling booth will provide a consistent Township presence and ensure branding and visibility at every event. Booth materials may include but are not limited to:

- 175th anniversary promotional swag for sale
- Historical information and displays
- Community engagement materials (e.g., photos, message boards, children's activities etc.)
- Township services and program information
- Cake
- Event specific feature

**Community Partnerships:** Staff will work with local event organizers and businesses to enhance existing events and introduce new opportunities under the 175th anniversary banner.

**Inclusive, Year-Long Activities:** Events will be scheduled across all seasons are areas of the Township and are tailored to diverse audiences—families, seniors, youth, outdoor enthusiasts, and more.

- Create a calendar of events to include staffing and Council representation
- Launch promotional campaign in November/December 2025
