The Secretary called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

2021 Inspection Results

Members reviewed the inspection results and were in favour of the Public Works Department completing in-house maintenance to address the concerns raised in the inspection reports.

2022 Budget

Members received the 2022 Council approved budget and questioned why the budget line for wages had decreased. Members would like to ensure sanitation and upkeep of the washrooms will be improved.

Direction was given to the Secretary to confirm the wage budget.

2022 User Fees

The Secretary advised the Committee of the intention to raise user fees by \$1 per hour for 2022. Members questioned the motivation behind raising the fees, as the increase in revenue was minimal.

Member Little confirmed that any increase in cost for Minor Baseball would be borne by the registered families.

Direction was given to the Secretary to obtain a projected increase of costs for each league.

Members discussed the importance of recreation for children and the impacts the rising cost of living is having on families. The Committee would like to ensure that inflation does not impact children's ability to participate in sport.

Moved by Little and Seconded by Greer

WHEREAS families have experienced a rise in the costs of many necessities that have made it difficult to attain economic security;

AND WHEREAS recreation is important for socialization and social-emotional maturity into health adulthood;

THEREFORE the Committee request an increase of \$2 for the Adult's Men league;

AND THAT the Minor Baseball rates remain unchanged.

Maintenance Requirements

Members discussed the need for a new pitching mound and agreed greater discussion with Public Works is required prior to the maintenance being completed.

Walking path locations were discussed. Direction was given to move forward with upgrading the walking path recommended by Public Works.

5.2 Thomson Trail Park

Maintenance Requirements

Members expressed the desire to maintain the limestone path at Thomson Trail and recommend maintenance to address encroaching weeds.

Upgrades

The Secretary advised the Committee that Council approved the purchase of a swing set for the Park as part of the 2022 Budget.

Discussion ensued surrounding future betterments including the potential for development of a pavilion at the Thomas Trail or Maes Crescent parks.

Members discussed the development of the Community Ice Rink and recommended the purchase of two 36" aluminum shovels. The Secretary advised the Committee that a meeting with the Ice Rink Community Volunteers will be scheduled to discuss improvements for the 2022-2023 ice season, including the adjustment of hockey times. The Committee expressed a desire to be more involved in discussions moving forward surrounding rink times.

Direction was given to the Secretary to advise the Committee of the time and date for the Community Ice Rink Meeting.

Members discussed tree maintenance in the park and requested that staff ensure any dangerous trees are addressed in 2022.

MEETING DATE: March 28, 2022 SUBJECT: User Fee Analysis

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to provide the Committee with projected costs for the 2022 season.

BACKGROUND:

At the Mansfield Parks Committee meeting held on February 28, 2022 the Secretary advised the Committee of a proposed rate increase of \$1 per hour for the Men's and Minor Ball Leagues.

The Committee passed the following motion and gave direction to the Secretary to obtain a projected increase of costs.

Moved by Little and Seconded by Greer

WHEREAS families have experienced a rise in the costs of many necessities that have made it difficult to attain economic security;

AND WHEREAS recreation is important for socialization and social-emotional maturity into health adulthood;

THEREFORE the Committee request an increase of \$2 for the Adult's Men league;

AND THAT the Minor Baseball rates remain unchanged.

CARRIED.

ANALYSIS:

At the regular Council meeting on March 2, 2022 staff advised Council of the request made by the committee to maintain minor ball rates and increase the rates of the Men's league by \$2 per hour. Council received the request by the Committee and passed the following motion.

Moved by Hawkins and Seconded by Cufaro

WHEREAS Council received the request from the Mansfield Parks Committee to increase Adult Men's League by \$2 per hour with Minor Baseball rates remaining unchanged;

NOW THEREFORE Council direct staff to amend the Schedule of Fees to address the request of the Mansfield Parks Committee and increase the Adult Men's League by \$2 per hour.

SUBJECT: Pitching Mound Repairs

PURPOSE:

To inform the Committee of options and pricing for repairs requested to the pitching mound.

BACKGROUND:

Over the past several years, the pitching mound has had minor repairs / maintenance performed on it. Locally sourced materials (from roadsides) has always been used. I.E. Red clay.

Good quality clay has become more difficult to obtain this way.

After researching sources for this type of material I contacted Mar-Co Clay.

They proposed 2 options.

OPTION # 1

Complete mound surface rehabilitation.

Materials required from them.

1 – REDIKIT

\$500.00 plus tax and shipping

REDIKIT consist of 26 bags of RediMound 24 bags of RediBricks (8 brick per bag) = 192

OPTION # 2

Repairing the mount using the same method as used in the past.

Materials required from them.

54 x 18 kg sealed bags of REDIMOUND

\$300.00 plus tax and shipping

This amount would leave a supply on hand for ongoing repairs as required.

FINANCIAL IMPACTS:

The cost of the materials is accounted for in the 2022 budget.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING THE REDIKIT TO REPAIR A PITCHING MOUND

1. LAYOUT & SITE PREP

- Measure and mark out the plateau & landing area. (see diagram A)
- B. Establish your finish grades. (see diagram B)
- Using a pick axe and shovel, dig out the marked area 3 1/2" below finished grade. Lightly rake it and apply water. No puddles.

2. INSTALLATION OF THE MATERIALS

A. Prepare base of excavation area for the RediBricks


- Spread out a 1" layer (approx. 15 bags) of moisturized RediMound clay over the excavated area.
- ii. Tamp well.
- Add RediMound as needed and tamp again to create a smooth level surface that is 2 1/2" lower than the finish elevation.
- iv. Apply water to provide a bond to the brick you are about to install.


B. Installing the RediBricks

- Begin at the pitching rubber and place a row of RediBricks the full width of the excavated area. (see diagram A)
- Lay in the next lines of RediBricks as snug and straight as possible, then continue to lay the bricks row by row making sure the bricks are placed tightly one to the next.
- iii. Complete the plateau area first, then the landing area. (see diagram A & B for pattern and slope)
- iv. When all the bricks have been placed, backfill the edges of the excavated areas with material that you had dug earlier and tamp the edges very hard to hold in the outside brick.
- Spread a light layer of RediMound clay (approx. 5 bags) and brush it into any cracks in the brick pattern.
- vi. Tamp the RediMound clay and brick together.
- vii. If there are any irregularities in the finish, spread RediMound clay and rake it level.
- viii. Then tamp it thoroughly.

3. FINISHING TOUCHES

- Spread a light layer of conditioner (such as calcined clay) over the completed mound.
- B. Use a tarp to control the moisture level of the mound.
- C. Any RediMound or RediBrick left over from project can be used for on-going maintenance.





TIPS

- A. Use an old t-shirt or empty plastic bag on end of the tamp to keep the moisturized clay from sticking to your tamp.
- B. Applying moisture between the applications of RediMound and RediBrick is essential to creating the bond between materials.
- C. Applying water to clay must be done carefully. A fine mist or a watering can is best. Apply slowly and allow the clay to absorb the moisture before applying more. Avoid puddling.
- D. Use tarps as a way to control the moisture level of these clay areas; both to protect the areas from excessive rain or sun.



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INSTRUCTIONS FOR USING THE REDIKIT TO BUILD 2 BATTER'S BOXES

1. LAYOUT & SITE PREP

- String a line from 2nd base through the center of home plate.
- B. Survey and establish finish grade of the box.
- C. Establish the centre line of the boxes. (see diagram)
- D. Mark out the boxes. (see diagram)
- E. Using a pick axe and shovel, dig out the batter's boxes 4" below the height of home plate. (Be careful not to exceed 4" depth in your digging or you will need more RediMound than is provided in the RediKit)
- F. Lightly rake it and apply water. No puddles.

2. INSTALLATION OF THE MATERIALS

A. Prepare base of the excavated area for the RediBricks


- Spread out a 1" layer of moisturized RediMound clay (approx 4 bags per batter's box) over the complete box area.
- ii. Tamp firmly.
- Add RediMound as needed and tamp again to create a smooth level surface that is 3" lower than the finish grade.
- iv. Apply water to provide a bond to the brick you are about to install.

B. Installing the RediBricks

- Begin at one end of a batter's box and place a line of RediBricks the full width of the box. (see diagram)
- Lay in the next lines of RediBrick as snug and straight as possible, then continue to lay the bricks row by row making sure the bricks are placed tightly one to the next.
- iii. When all the bricks have been placed, backfill the edges of the excavated areas with material that you had dug earlier and tamp the edges very hard to hold in the outside brick.
- iv. Spread a light layer of RediMound clay (approx 3 bags per batter's box) and brush it into any cracks in the brick pattern.
- v. Tamp the RediMound clay and brick together.
- If there are any irregularities in the finish, spread RediMound clay and rake level the surface of the whole box area.
- vii. Then tamp it thoroughly.

3. FINISHING TOUCHES

- A. Spread sliding material over the completed batter's boxes and rake to the desired grade and appearance.
- Sliding material (approx 1/4" depth) will typically be the same as the material covering home plate area.
- C. The elevation of the finished surface should be the same height as home plate or slightly lower (1/8").



TIPS

- A. Use an old t-shirt or empty plastic bag on end of the tamp to keep the moisturized clay from sticking to your tamp.
- B. Applying moisture between the applications of RediMound and RediBrick is essential to creating the bond between materials.
- C. Applying water to clay must be done carefully. A fine mist or a watering can is best. Apply slowly and allow the clay to absorb the moisture before applying more. Avoid puddling.
- D. Use tarps as a way to control the moisture level of these clay areas; both to protect the areas from excessive rain or sun.

Dufferin County Economic Development Fund Reporting

The EDC received the Dufferin County Economic Development Implementation Fund grant in February 2020 the amount of \$30,000 to be used towards the development of a cycling strategy to promote recreation and tourism in Mulmur through cycling and increase spending at area businesses.

In 2020 the EDC issued an RFP and awarded the design and development of a cycling materials and signage to Christian Beausoleil.

Consultation with cyclists, user groups, municipal staff and the Economic Development Committee led to the recommendation that cycling stations be installed in areas where cycling is most prominent for residents, children and visitors, as well as where the municipality is focusing its "Share the Road" efforts. Consideration of impartiality, liability and maintenance was also given when identifying locations on governmental and private lands. The following locations were selected to receive the following infrastructure:

Dufferin Forest (Main Tract)

- Cycling Stand
- Fix-it Station
- Signage

Pine River Fishing Reserve

- Cycling Stand
- Bench
- Signage

Kilgorie Mailboxes

- Bench
- Signage

Municipal Office

Next Steps

Due to time constraints and weather, cycling station infrastructure and signage will be installed in Spring 2022.

Economic Impact

Where possible, the Township secured the services of local vendors to support their initiatives including Cycling Elements in Orangeville and Dunwood Signs & Textiles in Dundalk.

- 2. Growing a Connected Mulmur: Communication with and social connectivity within the Mulmur community.
- 3. Growing a Supportive Mulmur: Providing local services to support the needs of Mulmur residents and businesses.
- Growing a Sustainable Mulmur: Being Proactive in Sustainable Initiatives to ensure the long term well being of Mulmur (includes Resources/Financial/People).

Within each path, goals are identified and supported by action items. Goal Four of Growing a Sustainable Mulmur is to promote and preserve Mulmur's natural attractions to residents through:

- Promotion of the Bruce Trail
- Supporting cycling and equestrian activities in the Dufferin Forest, trails and roads
- Encouraging the development of the Pine River Fishing area

The development of cycling infrastructure throughout the Township has supported Council's strategic plan and has accomplished Goal Four of Growing a Sustainable Mulmur. A copy of the 2020-2024 Strategic Plan can be found as Schedule A.
