Points

- 2 Points for a win
- 1 point for a tie
- 0 points for a loss

Players

- Players must be 18 years of age to be eligible to play.
- If you are pregnant, you will not be allowed to play.
- No jewelry is permitted to be worn during play.

Equipment

- Metal spikes are not allowed, but rubber spikes are acceptable.
- The catcher must wear a facemask.
- Pitcher and batter helmets are mandatory.

Play

- All games are 50 minutes, unless intercepted by rain or other unsuitable conditions deemed so by the umpire. Four complete innings are considered a complete game.
- While the game is in play, players are not to step on to the field out of the dug out until "Time" is called by the umpire.
- No infield fly rule will apply.
- Interference The runner will be called out if they impede the fielders who are in the act of making a defensive play.
- Obstruction Is when a fielder who is not in possession of the ball and not in the act of fielding the ball, impedes the progress of any runner. The ball is then called "dead" and a base is awarded to the runner from the point of obstruction.

Innings:

Five runs per inning or three outs for each of the first four innings,

- Fifth inning is open
- Extra innings can be played depending on time
- Innings must be finished even if the game runs over 50 minutes.
- No extra innings will be started after 50 minutes of play.

Batter:

- Is allowed only three pitches.
- If after the third pitch the ball is not hit fair, the batter is out.
- If the ball hits the pitcher, the play is dead, and the batter is out
- If the ball hits the screen, the ball is dead, and a strike is called against the batter.

Runner

- Must touch the ORANGE bag if there is a play at first base.
- May touch white bag if attempting to go to second base.
- There will be no stealing bases or lead offs.
- Cannot touch Homeplate.
- Sliding is permitted at 2nd and 3'd bases only
- Running off the baseline The base path comes into existence the moment a
 defensive player with the ball attempts to tag a runner. The base path is a
 straight line between the base runner and the base to which the runner is
 advancing or retreating, The runner cannot deviate from it to avoid the tag more
 than three feet to the left or right roughly. If the runner does so, they would be
 called out for leaving the base path.

Fielders

- Pitcher is only required to catch the ball from an infielder.
- Rover must start on the grass before the ball is hit and cannot throw to pitcher,
- Outfielders 150 field marker is not in force. May throw anywhere but not to pitcher.
- Ball thrown from Outfield to Infield does not require a cutoff * can throw anywhere except to pitcher.

Courtesy Runner:

- is the last person out furthest in the batting order.
- a courtesy runner can be used for INJURY only.
- Once a player takes a courtesy, a courtesy runner will be provided for that player for the remainder of the game.

MANDATE AND ACHIEVEMENTS:

MANDATE GOAL #1: Pursue new opportunities identified in the Recreation Efficiency Study (Connected, G2, A3)

2023 Actions:

- Honeywood Baseball Diamond: made recommendation to Council for improvements to the diamond for use by Minor Ball and the community.
- Thomson Trail Park: Grand opening on new playground
- Maes Crescent Park: members continue to monitor the passive parklands.
- Outdoor Ice Rink: Volunteer recognition

MANDATE GOAL #2: Make recommendations to Council and staff in regard to use fees, future maintenance and park improvements (Transfer Agreement 2009/10)

2023 Actions:

Reviewed and made recommendations to advertising signage rates and user fees.

Identified 2023 maintenance requirements for completion including:

- Batter's Boxes
- Lime Shed Repair
- Fencing Repair
- Repair leaks at equipment shed
- Upgrades to Walking Path
- Edge infield to address encroaching weeds
- Better supply and sanitation at washrooms facilities
- Maintain clay supply for pitchers mound and home plate at the diamond
- New signage
